



Dress Code Reminder!

<u>Shirts/straps</u>: No tank tops, crop tops, or jerseys – shirts should appropriately cover shoulders, cleavage, back, and midriff. You may wear a shirt underneath a shirt that does not meet dress code guidelines to make it appropriate for school. Shirts should not feature any mature content (drug or alcohol references, sexual innuendo, feature weapons or promote violence.)

Pants/hemlines: Pants or leggings with major rips or holes are not appropriate for school. Shorts, skirts, and dresses must be no more than 4 inches above the kneecap or must reach the student's fingertips when the student stands with arms down at his/her sides. Leggings can be worn underneath pants/shorts/skirts/dresses that do not meet dress code guidelines to make them appropriate for school. However, leggings on their own are not appropriate without a top that is long enough to cover the student's nether regions.

<u>General</u>: Hats, hoods, scarfs, skull caps, and other head coverings are not to be worn in school. Sunglasses are not to be worn in school. Neither are pajamas or see-through clothing items. Backpacks are not to be carried unless there is a current and valid gold card attached to it.
